\$600 and \$1,000 to make, plus promotion and the cost of having it pressed.

After some six months in the recording process, members of the Imposters hope to have an "EP" or "extended play" record in their hands by mid-December.

The "EP" is a cross between a "45"

and a full-length album.

"I hope we can land a record contract with this," Gurganus said.

The group plans to contact some major distributors who would give the record to disc jockeys with the hope that it could break into a national market.

The Imposters, who have performed at private clubs, have added a new drummer — Ed Billeter — to the group while working on the project.

Two other members, Clint and Sandy Alguire, left the group before

the taping was completed.

Gurganus does vocals and guitar, with guitarist Terry Rohr and bass player Rick Wallenbaugh. Kelly Fullmer also does vocals.

"if nothing else, we've gotten a lot of peace of mind out of this," Gurga-

nus said.
